



At the end of July, 2010 and into the first part of August Ralph will be ministering in the city of Khabarovsk, Russia. This city, located in an area north of North Korea and just west of the Sea of Japan on the border with Communist China has quite a history of bloodshed and forced labor camps where many died for their faith within our lifetime. Ralph will be registered with

the government and in the country on a "religious visa" which means every event and activity he will be involved in must be recorded and registered ahead of time and his movements and activities will be closely monitored by the authorities.

His travels will take him to Calgary, Frankfurt, Germany and then to Moscow (a 24 hour trip). Here he will stay overnight and catch the connecting flight from Moscow to Khabarovsk the next day (another 9 hour flight equivalent to the Calgary-Frankfort portion of the trip the day before). Once in Khabarovsk he will be preaching and ministering prophetically at five public services a day for 8 days. Then, after a day of fellowship with the sponsoring pastor, he will head out on the return trip via Moscow, Frankfurt, Calgary and home. He will be gone from July 29th to August 10th and would greatly appreciate your prayers for all aspects of this trip including preparation time as he needs to have 40+ teachings prepared ahead of time.

Next Sunday we will celebrate the Lord's Supper together let us recognize it as:

1. A time of remembrance - Worshippers remember the Lord, Jesus Christ, who He is, what He has done for them, we must understand the significance of the body and blood of Jesus as we celebrate.

(1 Corinthians 11:23-25)

1. A time of proclamation - As they celebrate together, worshipers preach the Gospel to principalities and powers, visitors, and anyone willing to listen. (1 Corinthians 11:26)

2. A time of self-examination - It is a time of repentance and cleansing. Worshippers ask the Lord to expose the works of darkness and dispel the power of the enemy and then gratefully receive forgiveness. (1 Corinthians 11:27-32)

3. A time of blessing - The blessing of the Lord rests upon His people as they worship in His presence. As they rejoice in Him He gives them His joy, which is their strength. (1 Corinthians 10:16)

4. A time of fellowship and unity - The Lord binds worshippers' hearts together thankful praise as they remember and proclaim the broken body of the Lord, turn to Him in true humility and repentance, and receive his blessing. His life draws them together and gives them unity in the Holy Spirit. (1 Corinthians 10:17)

Intimate communion and fellowship with God is a priceless privilege and yields great stability in each Christian's life.

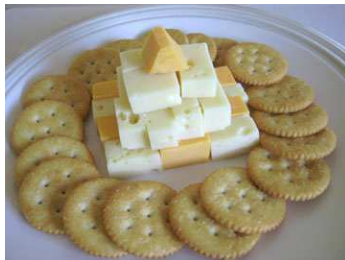
